HOW CAN WE IMPROVE GRADUATE EMPLOYABILITY

Universities have a heightened responsibility for assuring that higher education alumni have the developed capacity to obtain and/or create work. The goal of this workshop is to supplement the knowledge, skills and resources academics and university leaders have to improve graduate employability.

EVIDENCE BASED PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT

The interactive workshop, co-led by Associate Professors Shelley Kinash and Linda Crane, will summarise their collaborative research project's key findings regarding the discrepant perspectives of the four stakeholder groups of students, graduates, employers and higher education personnel, based on analysed data from 705 survey respondents and 147 interviewees and focus group participants.

The workshop will include the range of activities universities have implemented regarding employability, including the Beyond Bond and Bond Core initiatives.

Customised workshops of 2 - 6 hours are offered, depending on your requirements. Supporting the Australian Government Office for Learning and Teaching ethos of collaboration and impact, **there will be no presenter charge for this workshop.**
